## **Project Manager**

## **DUTIES:**

- Manage and/or prepare drawings, functional designs, final designs, contract drawings, cost estimates and tender documents, , through the use of internal staff and/or consultants, ensuring projects meet technical, financial and schedule requirements for sewer, watermain and roadwork projects.
- Coordinate the retaining of consultants to provide engineering services for projects.
- Obtaining all regulatory approvals for assigned projects.
- Liaise with internal staff both within the department and with other City departments and external agencies and consultants during the design and construction of projects.
- Monitor and co-ordinate construction progress, contractor and consultant performance, including preparation of progress certificates, negotiation of contractor/consultant claims, budget, schedule and safety performance, and conducting of site meetings.
- Respond to general and specific inquiries regarding projects from various stakeholders, including the general public.
- Ensure contractor compliance with contract and Corporate and MOL health and safety requirement
- Co-ordinate public meetings, as they pertain to capital projects.
- Provide technical guidance and direction to subordinate staff.
- Draft council reports.
- Prepare cost estimates for Capital Budget preparation.
